

Treasurer's Report


I have the pleasure of presenting Financial Statements for the year ended on 31st March 2023 and the Auditor's report to the 148th AGM of YWCA of Bombay, in keeping with good governance practices and statutory compliances. The Audited Statement of Accounts has



been circulated to members earlier and will be tabled for adoption. The year 2022 – 2023 was a conservative budget, keeping in mind that we had just come out of the pandemic and were awaiting normalcy. The reinvented schemes that were introduced during COVID-19 for Hostel and Guest houses are being currently still implemented. In spite of the setback we have coped and got the desired results as one can gather from this report.


The Income & Expenditure Statement for the year shows a surplus of ₹. 51,08,961 compared to the previous year's surplus of Rs. 77,75,684/-.

Total Income of the Association ₹ 763.18/-




Sources of Income: IC (33%), Hostels (30%), Asha Kiran (14%), and Others (23%). The figures are represented below.

An overview of the financial results of our four Hostels and Guest Houses is as follows. The same is contained in the bar graph given below. The occupancy has increased due to the markets opening up post-covid and our schemes being extremely lucrative to ensure full occupancy and respite to students and before working community through our hostels and guest house this year, we continued curtailing expenses which resulted in a surplus, thus contributing to our income generation.

- **LWH at Fort** has a surplus of ₹83,78,544 as compared to last year's surplus of ₹68,06,110/-. It has shouldered the major responsibility in income generation.
- DDH at Andheri has a deficit of (₹72,90,789/-) as compared to last year's surplus of ₹27,33,317/- Here we ensured very low rental charges as prescribed by the government, to encourage students from lower economic background.
- Anugraha Hostel at Belapur has a surplus of ₹28,12,395/- whereas last year's surplus was ₹10,84,941/-.
- **ABH at Byculla,** being a subsidized residence, compared to the other three hostels has a deficit of (₹.13,54,080/-) The surplus for the year 2021–2022 was Rs 89,091/-.

 DLH at Colaba is not in use due to Government Notice: DLH is not in use due to unsafe lack of safety. Expenses incurred are mainly due to Rent and taxes, and maintenance.



Asha Kiran has contributed ₹. 1,05,18,430/- to the income of the Association during the FY 2022-23, which has doubled compared to ₹.52,25,079/- in the previous Financial Year.

International Center has contributed ₹. 2,56,64,356 to the income of the Association during FY 2022-23, which has grown by aprox 60% in comparison to ₹. 1,63,20,194/- in the previous Financial Year.

The guest house has experienced a rise in its revenue as a result of the market reopening, in contrast to the previous year when the market was sluggish and constrained due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Women's Development Unit has played a pivotal role in leveraging Bombay Y's financial support to fulfill the Trust's mission through a range of community development programs focused on women and children. In the fiscal year 2022-23, the unit allocated a total of ₹. 63,10,576, marking a substantial increase compared to the ₹. 48,05,529 spent in the preceding fiscal year 2021-2022. This increase represents an impressive expenditure growth of approximately 30%. Additionally, it's noteworthy that the department has demonstrated resourcefulness in securing additional funding for select projects during this year.



Tax on Income: Currently no income tax is payable by the Association as per the Bombay Trust Act 1950. This provision is likely to be repealed. The Association will need to take cognizance of this and make suitable provisions to mitigate risks of potential tax levies.

From the surplus of ₹. 51,20,085/- a sum of ₹. 25,00,000/- has been transferred to Sinking Fund Reserve.

Finance

The Finance Committee comprises of Finance Chairperson, Treasurer, and Chairpersons of all committees. All members actively participate in the finance requirements of individual committees and departments and financial matters of the Association as a whole.

- During the monthly meetings the statement of accounts of all departments were scrutinized and approved.

In today's nuclear world, seniors often experience isolation, both physically and emotionally, as their children pursue their own lives. At our four centers, we've taken the initiative to combat this isolation.
