- **Distinguishing Journalism from Propaganda:**

Discerning information through press freedom and evaluating unbiased journalists helps differentiate factual

reporting from biased narratives. It prompts us to question if information undergoes alteration in translation, ensuring accuracy.

- **Verification and Independent Research:**

Proverbs 14:25 emphasizes the importance of truthful witnesses. By corroborating information through independent fact-check, we can disseminate verified facts.

- **Up-to-Date Information and Image Verification:**

Being wise as serpents (Matthew 10:16) underscores the importance of up-to-date information. Verifying images, using tools like reverse image searches, prevents the circulation of outdated stories and manipulated visuals, fostering a precise perception of reality.

- **Balancing Perspectives:**

Proverbs 18:13 encourages seeking understanding from both sides, prompting us to explore if people from the same ethnic groups are facing harassment in diaspora. Thorough comprehension of ideologies on both sides to promote peace for the other with supporting evidence is a must.

- **Testing Knowledge and Bias:**

Probing information accessibility on both sides sheds light on potential biases. Questioning who benefits from a dominant narrative uncovers obscured truths.

In navigating conflicts, adopting a biblical approach equips us to discern truth from bias, thereby fostering a commitment to justice, accountability, and ultimately, lasting peace.

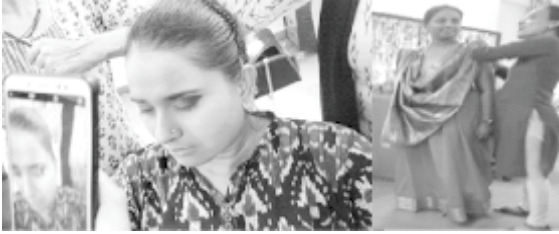
