### Faith and Wisdom: Biblical lessons from others Annie Cardoz

The Holy Bible offers numerous examples of how God's wisdom and mercy extends beyond the boundaries of our religious community and engaging with people from different backgrounds can enrich our spiritual journey.

Ruth, a Moabite woman, chose to leave her people and gods to stay with her mother-in-law, Naomi, and follow the God of Israel. Despite being a foreigner, Ruth's loyalty earned her a place in the community of Israel, lineage of King David and ultimately Jesus Christ.

The Roman centurion, a Gentile in Matthew 8:10 approached Jesus with great faith, asking Him to heal his servant. Despite being outside the Jewish faith, the centurion's faith and trust in Jesus' power impressed Christ, who said, "I have not found anyone in Israel with such great faith".

Rahab, a Canaanite prostitute, recognized the power of the God of Israel and acted to protect the Israelite spies in Jericho. Thus, people with different beliefs or from troubled backgrounds can offer us lessons in faith.

The Queen of Sheba, a foreign ruler, visited King Solomon in Jerusalem to seek his wisdom, and recognised the greatness of the God of Israel. This story encourages us to engage in meaningful exchanges with others, where God's truth can be acknowledged and valued by people outside our faith.

These examples show us that interacting with others can be an opportunity to learn valuable lessons, strengthen our own beliefs, and witness the universal aspects of God's wisdom that transcends the limits of the Christian belief.

## Report on Awareness talk on 'Strengthening Communication'

PASI Committee of YWCA of Bombay organized an enlightening session on "Strengthening Communication" on 8<sup>th</sup> August. The session was led by Aziel Marques, Founder of GPS for Parents, in parent-child communication strategies.

The session delved into the essence of communication and its pivotal role in fostering relationships, whether with loved ones, friends, or in professional settings. Ms Marques highlighted the importance of effective communication in building and maintaining strong connections.

A key focus of the session was the importance of sharpening listening skills, which was identified as the cornerstone of all other communication skills. Listening not only helps in understanding others better but also in responding more effectively, thus strengthening bonds.

Moreover, the session drew a connection between communication and leadership, emphasizing that good communication is integral to effective leadership. The expert shared several strategies aimed at enhancing communication skills and, in turn, deepening relationships and building stronger connections.

Participants left the session with practical insights and tools to improve their communication abilities, contributing to their personal and professional growth.

Topic: Nobel Laureate in Economic Sciences Ms. Claudia Goldin and her work on gender gap in women participation in the workforce

Ms. Claudia Dale Goldin (born May 14, 1946) is an American economic historian and labour economist. She is the Henry Lee Professor of Economics at Harvard University. In October 2023, she was awarded the Nobel Memorial Prize in Economic Sciences "for having advanced our understanding of women's labour market outcomes". She is the third woman to be awarded the Nobel Prize for Economics, and the only female solo winner since it was first awarded in 1969.

Ms. Claudia Goldin explained the historical roots of the workplace and wage gaps faced by women around the world.

- 1) A persistent Gender Gap: "Women are now more educated than men," Ms. Goldin noted in an interview with The Associated Press. "They graduate from college at much higher rates than men. They do better in high school than men do. So why do these differences exist?
- 2) A persistent Pay Gap The earnings disparity between men and women narrowed as more women went to work. Once a woman has a child, her pay tends to drop and subsequently doesn't grow

as fast as it does for men, even among women and men with similar educational and professional backgrounds.

- 3) Marriage Barrier Ms. Goldin also discovered that marriage proved to be a more serious barrier to women's employment than had been previously thought
- 4) The U- shaped Curve U-shape is in no way unique to the US and holds true in many other countries. These insights make it possible to better map and understand women's position in the labour market
- 5) Ms. Goldin identified the key culprit

  their partners, in balancing childcare
  and work responsibility.

internationally.

6) Importance of Expectation – The labour market consists of different generations, cohorts, who faced different circumstances when making



their life choices. Goldin developed a cohort-based approach to the analysis of what happens when a cohort enters the labour market. In the early twentieth century, for example, most women were only expected to work for a few years prior to marriage and then to exit the labour market upon marriage, which influenced their educational choices. Goldin showed that in periods of rapid development, women may make decisions based on expectations that later do not come to fruition.
